Rethinking UN SDG Agenda in the Post Pandemic Era: Building new priorities, facing new challenges and seizing opportunities.

<u>Presentation</u>: From the international organizations to our own little communities and families, everything has been shaken by the current COVID-19 pandemic. Global problems associated with poverty, hunger, and surely health, have been foregrounded. The crisis has led to a lot of new issues and accelerated many others. When it is just a decade to reach the deadline of the SDGs and the 2030 Agenda, the path seems to have dramatically changed. This challenge also provides an opportunity to act for a fairer and greener society while tackling the consequences of this tremendous disruption. The conference will be student-led, strengthening the student centred value emphasized in the alliance, giving a main role to them, their rich ideas and voices speaking from all over Europe. "Rethinking SDG UN 2030 in the Post Pandemic Era" will look at the particular effect of the health crisis on the SDGs, especially in cities, inequalities, consumption and other topics in a transdisciplinary way. Encouraging the participation of experts in the fields and university students in order to create a joint conversation necessary to widen our perspectives and therefore work towards these goals while leaving no one behind.

1. **PROSPERITY**. The role of youth activism and / or higher education institutions in shaping global agendas after COVID19

- a. The role of the EU on fostering a green agenda.
- b. The impact (or lack of) global partnerships to address the health crisis 3. The effects of the pandemic on **PEOPLE**. Global/National/Regional and Local inequalities
- a. New forms of work. Online work
- b. Mental Health problems during and after the pandemic
- 4. **PLANET**. Environmental resilience. What could we learn from the effects on the environment after stopping most of our activities?
- 5. **PEACE**. Do global crises like the COVID19 foster better or worse global understanding? What's now and what can happen in the future.

• inspirational pitch: presenting an innovative idea (15 mins. presentation, followed by Q&A) • poster presentation: presenting research results (5 mins. presentation, followed by Q&A) • round table: discussion with peers (one hour panel discussion, with interactive modalities) • workshop: interactive session (90 mins. contribution)

Proposals for contributions can be sent in until May 6 2021 (mail to: lola.berna@upf.edu). Please give a short description of the topic you would like to present (350 words max.), the format you would choose for your contribution, your contact information and affiliation (home university).

The scientific committee will approve contributions by **May 27 2021**. The final program of the conference will be online by **June 14 2021**.
